Ato Reticulated Giraffe is a 6-year-old male giraffe. His name means "bright and shining" in Swahili. Ato was born at Fort Wayne Children's Zoo, and arrived at Brookfield Zoo in April 2017, as a potential mate for our female, Arnieta. The pair has not yet produced offspring, but we are hopeful they will in future years. Reticulated giraffes are endangered with primary threats being habitat loss and poaching. *Stop by Habitat Africa! The Savannah to see Ato today.*



Heidi Orangutan turned 5 years old in December and is a bundle of energy. She only sits still when she and her father, Ben, are taking turns using enrichment, or when she is being groomed by her mother, Sophia. Orangutan infants have the longest period of dependency on their mothers of any primate other than humans. Hope Polar Bear is a 5-year-old female polar bear who arrived at Brookfield Zoo this past January from Utah's Hogle Zoo. Polar bears are considered vulnerable to extinction with the biggest threat being climate change. Hope has been paired with our male polar bear, Hudson, based on a recommendation from AZA's Polar Bear Species Survival Plan.
